Theme

Communicating with someone who speaks another language.

Cultural Concept

Trust; the ability to build trusting relationships is the cornerstone of Nakota culture

Cultural Background

At the time when the Nakota people met with Lewis and Clark there was an interpreter named Mr. Durion who they trusted because he had married into the tribe.

Student Activities:

Students will be able to:

- 1. Discuss how they feel when they are not understood
- 2. Come up with a few questions or a short personal narrative that they write on an index card
- 3. Share with a partner in their native language what they wrote on their card; without using facial expressions or hand gestures
- 4. Discuss how they felt; one partner tells what they think the message was
- 5. Repeat #3 but use any facial expressions or hand gestures that might be helpful
- 6. Come together as a group and have the partners who spoke in their native language to talk to the whole group; discussion
- 7. Write to the prompting questions: How often do you think miscommunication happens? Do you ever need to translate for a parent/What is that like/Can you give an example? At conferences with a translator, what do you notice about the communication? If you were getting frustrated trying to communicate, did your face show that/Could someone see that as anger or meanness/What would happen to your attempt at friendly conversation if that happened?
