Title

There's No Place Like Home

Grade level

1st and 2nd Grade

Theme

Spirituality/Environmentalism

Duration

Five, 30 minute lessons

Goal

Students will identify where their family originated.

Objectives

- 1. Students will e able to identify geographical place, ie; country, state, city.

- 3. PERSONAL/SOCIAL Standard A: Students will acquire the knowledge, attitudes, and interpersonal skills to help them understand and respect self and others.

Cultural Concept

Lakota people believe they originated from within the Black Hills; so this area is sacred and needs to be cared for and preserved.

Cultural Background

As Goodman (1992) notes, the high elevation central prairies of the Black Hills were identifies in the 1870's with sightings of an abandoned "medicine lodge" and a large stack of elk horns, both of which have spiritual significance.

Student Activities

- 1. Students will identify "home".
- 2. Students will watch excerpts from the <u>Wizard of Oz</u> and discuss why would Dorothy want to leave Oz to go home.
- 3. Students will be shown a excerpts from <u>In the Light of Reverence</u> in regards to the Lakota story of the mother and child falling to Earth.
- 4. Students will be shown pictures of Pe Sla and then discuss why the Lakota and other tribes would purchase the property.
- 5. Students will identify what they call their home and how would they take care of that home.
- 6. Students will create a poster that names and explains their "home".
